He served as Chief Financial Officer for Thoratec Corporation (THOR: Nasdaq), Pleasanton, California, a manufacturer of electronic heart devices, which he helped take public. He has served on the board of various technology companies, was a guest lecturer on venture capital at UC Berkely and has served on various forums as a guest speaker on venture capital and new enterprise development.

Mr. Stewart completed his Bachelor's degree at Stanford University, Palo Alto, CA and his MBA in Finance at the Harvard Business School, Boston, MA.
